About our choirs

Choirs at Riverside are comprised of kids at all levels of experience! Students in choir learn advanced vocal technique through developing healthy singing habits as well as learning how to manage the adolescent voice. Students also develop advanced techniques in harmony singing as well as practice their proficiency with music literacy by reading notes and rhythms through daily music exercises. Choir meets every day as a class for the entire year. Students will sing unison, two-part, three-part, and even four-part literature in a wide variety of musical styles including Broadway, classical, folk, gospel, jazz, madrigal, and pop selections. There are both auditioned and non-audition groups available.

Required Classroom Materials

Items Expected EVERY DAY

- iPad
 - Charged for class use
 - Loaded with Canvas, Sight Reading Factory. Both <u>Free</u>
- Choir Binder
 - Only holds choir music
 - Provided by Mr. Rogers
 - Does not leave classroom

STRICTLY Prohibited Items:

- Cell Phones
- Chewing Gum
- Food/Drink (other than water)

- Pencil
 - For taking notes in music
 - Suggest leaving a pencil with the students choir binder



Formal Concert Attire

- DRESSES:
 - Students in one of the Treble Choirs will wear dresses for their concert uniform
 - <u>DRESS</u>: Each treble singer will be sized for a concert dress.
 - <u>SHOES</u>: Each treble singer will be sized and order caramel-colored character shoes

• SUITS:

- Students in the Tenor/Bass Choirs will wear suits for their concert uniform
- SHIRT: Each tenor/bass singer will purchase a white-dress shirt through the school
- <u>BLAZER</u>: Each tenor/bass singer will purchase a maroon blazer through the school
- <u>PANTS</u>: Each tenor/bass singer will purchase black pants which will arrived unhemmed through the school
- <u>SHOES/SOCKS</u>: tenor/bass singers *must provide solid black dress shoes and solid black socks for performances*

• GENERAL GUIDELINES

- <u>HAIR</u>: should be groomed and neat with consideration to avoid excessive decoration. Long hair will be groomed and kept away from the students faces
- <u>JEWELRY</u>: Students may not wear jewelry with concert attire unless provided by Mr. Rogers as part of a uniformed ensemble. Small, stud earrings are acceptable.

PAYMENT

- Student Uniform cost for the 2023-2024 season is **<u>\$90.00</u>**
- Checks written in blue or black ink should be made payable to Riverside Jr. High School with the student's name on memo line.
- Students may use "SNAP RAISE" to raise the money for their entire purchase!

Activity

Weekly Rehearsal Grade:

- Student behavior and rehearsal practices have a direct impact on the success of the performing group. Each week, students will receive a grade commensurate with their rehearsal contribution in class.

Performance Assessments

- Students will submit performance assessments through Sight Reading Factory or Canvas that will be evaluated against a specific rubric.

Written Assessments/Assignments

- Students will complete written assignments or assessments that show understanding of music literacy and history concepts used in class.

- Students will attend important rehearsal/performance events. Non-attendance must be made up with completion of assignment prior to end of the grading period
