Choir Rehearsal Contribution Rubric

Being part of a choir is the academic equivalent of being part of a team. Student behavior and rehearsal practices have a direct impact on the success of the performing group. Each week, students will receive a grade commensurate with their rehearsal contribution in class.

Distracts from Choir	60%	 Very Slow to follow directions Has to constantly be reminded to stay on task Talks or distracts others frequently Contributes very little to the choir
Not acceptable	45%	 Does not follow directions Chooses not to contribute to the choir
